Although it saves the least amount of money, I lean towards option 3b (option 2) - and hopefully one of those opening days is a Saturday.

It is a shame income cannot be found to raise the shortfall as opposed to reducing a public service, vital to many.

I feel this is a very difficult choice to make. I have been coming to Cwmbran library for over 35 years and now bring my 7 year old daughter, who also loves to read. The staff are always friendly and helpful and enjoy their work.

As an English Teacher with a love of words and language, I feel that reading is is such an important part of children's development.

Out of the limiting options, 3b (Option 2 here) would be the best option to give the communities which the libraries serve the best available access.

I don't want any of the options. Libraries are crucial to a community. They are the ONLY places that any members of the public are welcome, free of charge into a safe, warm environment where they can gain information and knowledge to improve their health and wellbeing, chances of employment and advance their education.

There will be a huge impact on future generations when libraries are no longer able to offer the amazing community support they currently do. People who go in from the Job Centre with no IT skills receive help and informal training in a library so they can claim Job Seekers allowance and look for work. Having computers without the skilled staff to help customers is useless. Older generations also receive training using their devices to communicate with family and participate in online shopping, paying bills, contacting their local council etc.

Customers need trained staff to help with information queries, book choice, ordering books from around Wales.

The Library@home service is a vital service for housebound customers. Hundreds of books are chosen, sorted and delivered every week from Torfaen and then returned and reshelved. This is hours of work behind the scenes for dedicated staff.

Reducing the staff by almost half will have a detrimental effect on everything the library service currently provides to Torfaen's population. 25,000 to 30,000 visits per month. Where will they all go? Customer visits will inevitably reduce when the service relies on self-issue machines. People will lose faith in the service and stop coming. Then of course you will be able to justify further cuts.

Running the service down bit by bit will have the desired effect so you can get rid of it completely. But where will these people go for free help, information, skilled tuition, books, human interaction?

Promoting literacy in babies and preschool children is another vital role of a

public library. The backlash on levels of literacy and education will be huge. We will eventually be facing a return to the days when only the upper classes could access information for their self improvement. Workers back Option 3b of the report (Option 2) seems the most sensible based on the provided information - however there will be an obvious bias in the responses from the different areas. Increasing the use of self-serve facilities also seems sensible.

The Council is having to react to a reduction in the money dispersed by the Welsh Government. It could react in different ways in an attempt to conserve services.

- 1. Reduce the use of credit cards which frequently are not used correctly.
- 2. Reduce the amount of money used for Councillor's expenses and for Council Officers.
- 3. Restrict the discount available for meals and journeys.

Remember that many of the libraries and other facilities used in the region were provided by the miners, steelworkers and others from their meager pay packets - given freely for the benefit of others.

Any reduction in the library provision is a retrograde step and may lead to a lowering in reading standards within schools. Many homes are on the breadline; money to provide suitable reading material for children and aid their development will be very restricted.
