

Activity 1

Are you a perfect passenger?

So you think you are a good passenger? Try this quiz to find out! Read each statement carefully and decide if it's TRUE or FALSE.

1. You must always wear a seatbeit in the car if there is one

Activity 3

Do you know the Green Cross Code?

The Green Cross Code helps us to make sure we always cross the road safely. Put the sentences below into the correct order from 1 -6.

Use your eyes and ears Look all around for traffic. Listen carefully.
Stop Stand on the pavement just behind the kerb.
Arrive alive Walk in a straight line, don't run, and get across safely.
Think first Find a safe place to cross then stop.
Look and listen as you cross When it's safe, walk straight across the road, still looking and listening while you cross.
Wait until it is safe to cross If traffic is coming, let it pass, don't cross until it's safe.

Remember you need to make sure you think about and use Road Safety any time you are near or on a road. It doesn't matter whether you are walking, cycling, in a car or on a bus. Talk about your journey with a parent or guardian to make sure you think about all the dangers you could face and how to stay as safe as possible.

Answer Sheet

Activity 1 – Are you a perfect passenger?

- 1. True it is illegal to not wear your seatbelt and puts you and other passengers in danger.
- 2. False if there is a seatbelt it is illegal not to wear it, even on a coach or minibus.
- 3. False it may be safer to slide over and get out the other side if that's the side the pavement is on. Always get out onto the pavement.
- 4. False only ever have as many people as seats and seatbelts in the vehicle.
- 5. True never distract a driver
- 6. False the bus driver needs to concentrate and not be distracted
- 7. False never put yourself or others in danger by leaning out of a vehicle
- 8. True the driver needs to be able to see out of the back
- 9. False only get off the bus at a designated bus stop. Remember never walk in front of the bus or try to cross the road until the bus has left.

Activity 2 – Do you know how to cycle safely?

Things wrong with the rider

- 1. No helmet
- 2. Wearing headphones so can't hear traffic
- 3. Carrying books, only one hand on the handlebars
- 4. Wearing baggy clothes that could get caught in the chain

Things wrong with the bike

- 1. Broken brake cable
- 2. Flat tyre
- 3. Chain coming off
- 4. No bell or lights

Activity 3 – Do you know the Green Cross Code?

1. Think first

Find a safe place to cross then stop.

2. Stop

Stand on the pavement just behind the kerb.

3. Use your eyes and ears

Look all around for traffic. Listen carefully.

4. Wait until it is safe to cross

If traffic is coming, let it pass, don't cross until it's safe.

5. Look and listen as you cross

When it's safe, walk straight across the road, still looking and listening while you cross.

6. Arrive alive

Walk in a straight line, don't run, and get across safely.

Activity 4 – Questionnaire

- 1. Select choices.
- 2. Think about walking safely, crossing safely, traveling in a vehicle safely, do you need any equipment
- 3. Think about how busy it will be. Will it be harder to cross? Do all drivers, driver safely? What could they be doing that might put other people in danger?
- 4. Zebra Crossing, Pelican Crossing (traffic lights), using a traffic island, Subway under the road, Footbridge over the road, lollypop person if you need to cross near a primary school that has a lollypop person you can cross here too.
- 5. Your Mobile phone put it away when you are near a road Listening to music – take earphones out when near a road Friends – make sure you all pay attention to the road, don't just follow your mate

Football/rugby ball – don't carry it in your hands where it can get dropped or knocked into the road, put it in a bag.
